

"SUPPLY CHAIN ISSUES: TRACKING DEVELOPMENTS IN THE SUEZ AND PANAMA CANALS, AND WHAT IT MEANS FOR YOUR BUSINESS"

Overview:

Due to rapidly changing circumstances in the Red Sea where commercial shipping is under attack from Iran-backed Houthi forces in Yemen, shippers are impacted globally both in cost and service.

The Red Sea attacks are already causing global shipping companies to reroute their voyages to avoid the Red Sea and Suez Canal area entirely.

Hundreds of voyages have rerouted around the Cape of Good Hope in Africa as a safe alternate routing from Asia to Europe. In short, the Suez Canal is no longer a safe and viable option for global ocean carriers.

Importers here in USA are affected from this Red Sea conflict because the Transatlantic Westbound trade from Europe to USA is impacted; furthermore, vessels and equipment involved in the Transpacific Eastbound trade from Asia to USA are also impacted.

The Panama Canal delays are caused by low water and the resulting slow transit and increased costs are starting to further complicate shipping for USA importers.

Please join this brief session on the ocean carrier outlook for importers and see how there is a new dynamic surging in the market that has suddenly and dramatically changed the supply and demand equation.

We will share an outlook for 2024 for planning out the supply chain to account for the new and dangerous times we are experiencing in global trade.
